Mayor Turnbow announced the motion carried and declared Bill 3969 as **Raymore City Ordinance 2025-032.**

B. Timber Ridge Final Plat

BILL 3968: "AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF RAYMORE, MISSOURI, APPROVING THE TIMBER RIDGE FINAL PLAT, A SUBDIVISION OF LAND LOCATED IN THE NORTHWEST QUARTER OF SECTION 17, TOWNSHIP 46N, RANGE 32W, RAYMORE, CASS COUNTY, MISSOURI."

City Clerk Erica Hill conducted the second reading of Bill 3698 by title only.

DISCUSSION: Councilmember Baker asked if a representative for the project was in attendance. Development Services Director David Gress stated Mr. Siebert was on his way, however, was not present yet.

Councilmember Baker noted UDC 450.080 regarding stormwater treatment plan requirements and asked if there was a plan on file for this project. Mr. Gress stated that would have been approved with the preliminary plat and rezoning application, adding that we review those for compliance at the final plat stage.

Councilmember Baker then noted UDC 445.030 regarding subdivision adjacency standards and asked about the proposed landscape buffer, swale, and yard matching. Mr. Gress stated subdivision adjacency kicks in when the lot dimensions

of the adjacent lot are different to an extent; staff reviewed those and requested the table of lot sizes at the preliminary plat to determine which element of screening would be most appropriate. The developer did choose screening without a berm along that eastern property line. There are screening requirements that are in the form of landscaping there also has to be a Type A screen along that property line because of the abutting zoning classifications so with the addition of the swale which will have somewhat of a berm the landscaping shouldn't be impacted all that much as the swale is a bit off of the property line which provides enough room for the trees to be established. Staff did review that for compliance based on the addition of the swale and found no issues.

10. New Business

A. Planning and Zoning Commission Appointment - Townsend

Resolution 25-25: "A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF RAYMORE, MISSOURI, APPROVING AN APPOINTMENT TO THE RAYMORE LICENSE TAX REVIEW COMMITTEE."

MOTION: By Councilmember Abdelgawad, second by Councilmember Holman to approve Resolution 25-33 by title only.

DISCUSSION: Councilmember Mills stated the voters have twice rejected Mr. Townsend as their representative in Ward 1. He noted other citizens have submitted applications to volunteer on the Planning and Zoning Commission.

Councilmember Baker concurred with Councilmember Mills. He added that with Mr. Townsend's time on Council, he might have developed relationships with developers and that this is a time to move away from that and consider someone that has not been part of Raymore's government.

Mayor Turnbow stated he disagreed with Councilmembers Mills and Baker. He recapped a couple of other applications that were submitted, noting that one would be a better fit for the Park Board.

Councilmember Abdelgawad also disagreed with Councilmembers Mills and Baker. She stated Mr. Townsend was voted in multiple times by voters in Ward 1 and appointments should be the people who are most qualified. She added that although it is good for new people to be appointed for new ideas and opinions, she feels Mr. Townsend's expertise and prior knowledge of City processes would be a benefit to the Planning and Zoning Commission. She feels having people on Boards and Commission who have been involved a while adds a valuable piece of history to conversations.

Councilmember Holman stated that the notion that he was rejected by the voters is moot as appointments are not elected positions and are made by the Mayor at the advice and consent of the Council. He reviewed the number of registered voters in Ward 1 and the number that voted in the April election, noting that only 5.5% voted. He provided a detailed review of Mr. Townsend's resume, accomplishments, and accolades.

Councilmember Mills stated that in talking to voters in Ward 1 their main complaint of Mr. Townsend was related to zoning issues.

Mayor Turnbow spoke to Mr. Townsend's credentials and integrity.

Councilmember Barber disagrees with Councilmembers Mills and Baker and noted this is the Mayor's appointment.

Councilmember Baker stated the Council owes to constituents to have discussions about credentials for appointments.

Mayor Turnbow stated he looked at all applications and feels Mr. Townsend is the best qualified volunteer for this appointment.

B. Award of Contract - Lake and Pond Management

City Clerk Erica Hill conducted the first reading of Bill 3964 by title only.

Assistant City Manager Ryan Murdock reviewed the staff report included in the council packet. The Parks & Recreation Department maintains Recreation Park Pond and Johnston Lake. This contract manages the chemical treatment at both locations, including the fountain maintenance at Recreation Park Pond and light trash maintenance at Johnston Lake. In addition, the selected vendor will work with the Missouri Department of Conservation on the biological well-being of the fish to ensure safe and free recreational fishing in the City and provide maintenance for the fountain at Johnston Lake. The contract is a one-year contract with the option to renew for two additional one-year terms. Staff sent out a request for proposals for these services and received two proposals, both qualified as complete proposals. Solitude Lake Management was found to be the lowest, best proposal.

C. Award of Contract - Broadmoor and Grandshire Drainage Improvements

Public Works Director Trent Salsbury reviewed the staff report included in the council packet. This project will install 1,200 feet of 6 inch underdrain along the back of the curb. Included in this will be the removal and replacement of some driveway approaches and tying into existing storm inlets with the underdrain. The City received three bids on April 24, 2025. Breit Construction was determined to be the lowest and best bidder. Staff recommends the contract for the Broadmoor/Grandshire Drainage Improvements Project be awarded to Breit Construction in the amount of \$139,928.

D. Award of Contract - Park Trails Replacement Phase II - Roadside Trails

BILL 3966: "AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF RAYMORE, MISSOURI, AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO ENTER INTO AN AGREEMENT WITH TERRY SNELLING CONSTRUCTION FOR THE PARK TRAILS REPLACEMENT PHASE II - ROADSIDE TRAILS PROJECT, CITY PROJECT NUMBER 25-449-200, IN THE AMOUNT OF \$903,074 AND AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO APPROVE CHANGE ORDERS WITHIN ESTABLISHED BUDGET CONSTRAINTS."

Public Works Director Trent Salsbury reviewed the staff report included in the council packet. This project consists of trail removal and replacement in several locations in the City's linear parks and various street right-of-ways. The City received five bids on April 23, 2025. Terry Snelling Construction was determined to be the lowest and best bidder. Staff recommends the contract for the Park Trails Replacement Phase II - Roadside Trails Project be awarded to Terry Snelling Construction in the amount of \$903,074. He answered questions from Council.

Assistant City Manager Ryan Murdock reviewed the staff report included in the council packet. Funded by the City Council in 2022, staff identified locations for three large marquee video display signs and coordinated the installation of the signs in conjunction with improvement projects scheduled in the capital improvement program. The locations include a new entrance sign at Recreation Park near the round-a-bout scheduled to be installed at the conclusion of the Raymore Activity Center expansion project, a new sign to be included in the design of the Hawk Ridge Park plaza project currently underway, and the final sign to replace the Municipal Center sign for City Hall at Skyline Drive and 58 Highway. The

project scope of work includes: development of designs for consideration and budgeting purposes, equipment specifications and selection, design and structural engineering, and cost estimates for purchase and installation. The Parks and Recreation Board has reviewed the locations and incorporated the signs into their capital projects. The Board will review designs and final plans for the signs associated with the park locations.

F. Watermark New Lender Refinancing Agreement

BILL 3971: "AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF RAYMORE, MISSOURI, AUTHORIZING CERTAIN DOCUMENTS RELATED TO THE CITY'S TAXABLE REVENUE BONDS (WATERMARK PROJECT), SERIES 2022."

City Clerk Erica Hill conducted the first reading of Bill 3971 by title only.

Economic Development Director Jordan Lea reviewed the staff report included in the council packet. Approval of this request would allow for the refinancing of the Watermark (The Depot) Project.

Dave Martin, Gilmore & Bell, noted he has reviewed the request and the documents. Originally supported by Chapter 100 Taxable Revenue Bonds (Series 2022), the project is now transitioning those bonds to a new lender. TTRES MO Raymore Dean Ave, LLC, the project's developer, is entering into new loan agreements with updated financial partners, including BREDIF CO SELLER LLC and SBNP SIA IV CO SELLER LLC, with Barings LLC as administrative agent. As part of the transaction, the developer is requesting consent for the reassignment of its rights under the bonds. Approval supports the financial restructuring of the project while maintaining oversight and compliance with prior agreements.

Councilmember Baker asked if this extends the timeline of the Chapter 100 and if the City has any monetary requirements. Mr. Martin stated that this has no effect on the Chapter 100 and the City has no fees in this transaction.

I. Budget Amendment - Trash, Recycling, and Yard Waste Fees

As part of the contract for trash, recycling, and yard waste collection, Constable Sanitation is requesting an adjustment in the fee for trash and recycling services. The current Consumer Price Index (CPI) for trash services is 5.1%. Constable is requesting a 3% increase for trash and recycling services. This equates to a \$0.47 increase in trash collection rates and a \$0.17 increase in recycling rates. He noted that with this increase Raymore's rates remain the best in the region.

K. Amendment to Correct Scrivener's Error to Ordinance 2025-004

City Manager Jim Feuerborn and City Attorney Jonathan Zerr stated the City was contacted by the Department of Revenue (DoR) regarding the submission of
